FROM THE DESK OF RABBI PEARL

Sunday night, January 16 and Monday January 17th, mark Tu B'Shvat, a cheerful day on the winter calendar. This holiday is commonly referred to as "New Year's Day for Trees". On it, the age of a fruit bearing tree is calculated, with ramifications for the consumption of fruit grown in the land of Israel. It is customary to eat a "new fruit", one that has not been consumed yet this year, in order to make the blessing "Shehecheyanu" thanking G-d for sustaining us and allowing us to reach this happy occasion. Dried carob fruit, bokser, has become commonly associated with the holiday, although no dentist will recommend eating it.

What I have always found uplifting about Tu B'Shvat is the message of life sustained amidst cold and ice. Trees endure amidst the cold temperatures, ice and snow of winter. Sap continues to flow under the bark. Life is there, even when all seems dead and frozen. No matter how barren the winter landscape may seem, renewal and regeneration await.

It seems that every day a new variant of the COVID virus that has turned our world upside down emerges. We race to get additional vaccines, and then are thrown into doubt as to whether they will work. We remove those annoying masks, only to have new mandates imposed that try our patience and endurance. When will it all end?

I have no definite answer. But the message of Tu B'Shvat is instructive and comforting. We don't always see what is going on, underneath the surface, hidden by the cold facts and icy news. But renewal awaits. Have faith these hard times will end, and a spring of health, safety and renewal awaits us all.
